### Message from the School Travel Planning Committee

So, if your child wears them every day, we have all days covered! Also, hopefully it will encourage the children to wear them everyday, especially now it is getting dark so early! By the way, we have 3 of each size left for purchase if your child would like one.

The assembly on Thursday that week will focus on road safety. We will be awarding the prizes for the mug competition, viewing the entries and watching a couple of the brilliant road safety films that the older KS2 children produced over half term. We would like to thank the road safety charity Brake for supplying us with posters and ideas for the assembly.

Next week, you will receive our Annual Travel Survey questionnaire - we need this to be completed

by all families by the 27th November. We will then use the information to complete our Annual Review, which is usually a 40+ page document telling County all the things the Travel Team have been up to. Without completing this review, we wouldn't maintain our level 3 status which in turn means we wouldn't receive the funding/grants for items such as cycle training and the bike/scooter shelter. PLEASE complete the survey and get it back to us ASAP - all returned surveys will be entered into a draw to receive £20 of Saddle Safari vouchers. They played with knucklebones, spinning tops and dice. The children were shown how to dress as a Roman citizen and two of the girls were chosen to have Roman style makeup applied. They also practised setting out a Roman road. In the afternoon, everyone joined the army and learned how to follow Roman commands,

which was a bit tricky! Those who brought in swords and shields were able to practise using them for battle and some were able to try out a gladiator's helmet and armour.
