

Remote Learning

In the unlikely event that Burford School should need to close, or partially close, this statement outlines the remote education pupils should expect to receive.

How long can I expect work set by the school to take my child each day?

Remote education (including remote teaching and independent work) will take pupils broadly the following number of hours each day:
